

WVCA Terminology for Members

Autocross:	A timed racing event where one car at a time negotiates a course where traffic cones are used.
Articles of Incorporation:	WVCA is registered with the Oregon Secretary of State as a non-profit corporation. Our registration may be viewed at www.sos.state.or.us .
Cruise-In:	A social event where cars are driven to a known destination; may include a Show and Shine.
Homecomings:	Corvettes are used to carry the home coming court around the football track at halftime. A Court member will sit on the deck of the cars. Members provide blankets for them to sit on and may provide golf umbrellas.
NWACC:	Northwest Association of Corvette Clubs (NWACC) is made up of corvette clubs in Oregon, Washington and British Columbia and provides WVCA's liability insurance.
Parade:	Driving in a local community parade, sometimes carrying dignitaries or courts.
Points:	Members recognition points are: <ul style="list-style-type: none">• One point for attending a sanctioned event.• One point for wearing club attire or name tag at a sanctioned event.• Three points for being a chair or host of a committee or event.• One point for attending each monthly business meeting wearing a name tag.• One point for being a working member of a committee or event. Points are kept by the secretary and tallied prior to the year-end banquet at which time the top 10% of the club receive recognition for participation.
Rally:	A driving event where the driver and a navigator try to get from point A to point B by following detailed written instructions.
Sanctioned Event:	An event that has been voted as approved by the general membership and/or conducted by the WVCA.
Save the Wave:	A corvette tradition to wave to individuals driving corvettes.
Show and Shine:	Car show in which the car is displayed and may or may not be judged.
